This was on the Mount of Olives just outside the Temple and Jerusalem city walls. Jesus knew he would be arrested and _____, and this made him feel very sad. He asked his disciples to stay awake with him while he prayed, but they were tired and full from the meal. Soon a crowd of people and soldiers came looking for Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. They had clubs and lanterns and swords. Judas Iscariot, one of Jesus' disciples, was with them. He had been paid 30 silver coins to point out who Jesus was to the soldiers. The soldiers and crowd took Jesus away to the house of Caiaphas, the high priest and president of the Sanhedrin. Do you know what the Sanhedrin is?
