

PUBLIC BROADCAST ANNOUNCEMENT

The following script can be used to create an announcement notifying the public about serious matters that affect their daily living. In this situation the public broadcast announcement will be about one of the plagues that was sent by God onto the Egyptians. The twist is that this story will be told in the modern day setting of Edmonton.

SCRIPT:

We interrupt this program to bring you a public broadcast announcement. Today at *(enter time)* _____ the entire city of Edmonton has been plagued with *(enter plague)* _____

Describe in detail how this plague is impacting citizens of Edmonton. How does it bother them, what long term impact will it have, where can you see the effects of the plague, what really annoying thing is the plague doing to people?

Earlier today we talked with one Edmontonian and *(enter name)* _____ told us that he/she saw *(provide an eye--witness account of seeing the plague)* _____

Edmontonians across the city are looking for an escape from the plague. Some have looked for help at *(list places people would look for help from the plague)* _____

It appears that no matter where people go - the plague follows them. The only people who appear safe from the plague are the people who call themselves Christians. Edmonton - if you want to be freed from this plague you must *(provide an instruction on how people of Edmonton could be freed from the plague like the Christians.)* _____

The following script can be used to create a call-in advice program where the program hosts accepts phone calls from kids needing help with a personal problem. In the program today you will explore a modern day Moses problem - how will God help guide you through a problem?

SCRIPT:

HOST: Welcome to Ask *(enter real or pretend name)* _____. Today we are taking calls from kids who need some advice for problems they are having in school. Our first call is from *(enter real or pretend name)* _____. Hello, how can I help you today?

CALLER: *(Create a problem that you think is common for kids at school and explain it in detail. Possible options may include bullying, friendship issues, temptation to cheat on a test, a bad report card, etc. Maybe you can even create a problem based on something you have seen or dealt with yourself.)*

HOST: Thank you for calling. I am sorry to hear that you are dealing with that problem. I want you to know that you are certainly not the only person to have dealt with big problems like this. The Bible has many stories where people had struggles or challenges that God helped them with *(Moses struggled with doubt that people would believe him, fear that he was not good enough to help God, people grumbling at him when plans did not go smoothly, anger when he killed an Egyptian)*. When I think about your problem, I am reminded that the Bible tells us *(Think about how the Bible would teach us to deal with the problem shared by the caller. Provide some advice for your caller based on what you think God would tell that person)*.

CALLER: Thank you so much for the advise.

HOST: You are welcome! Join us next time when we take calls from kids in the midst of a struggle to win back their school playground from intruders. Should they take weapons to fight or just march around with trumpets? Find out the answer next time on ASK _____.

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Bible answer man (or woman)

The following script can be used to create a radio program that answers peoples questiions about the Bible. This episode focuses on the story of Moses & the Exodus from Egypt.

SCRIPT:

BIBLE ANSWER (WO)MAN: It is a great day here at K-I-D-Z Radio and as always, I'm ready for your questions.If there is anything you want to know about the Bible, you have come to the right place. I've got all 66 books memorized and I know my stuff - that's why they call me the Bible Answer (Wo) Man. So come on boys and girls - pick up your phones and call 1-800-ANSWERS.

CALLER: Where can I find the story of Moses in my Bible.

BIBLE ANSWER (WO)MAN: You will find the story in the _____ Testament. It is the _____ book of 39 books of the old testament. It is also a part of a group of books called the Pentateuch, which includes the first 5 books of the Bible. It is called the Pentateuch because that word means five.

CALLER: How did Moses and the rest of God's people end up in Egypt?

BIBLE ANSWER (WO)MAN: God's people were descendants of _____ who brought his whole family to Egypt when there had been famine.

CALLER: Why did the Egyptian's turn God's people into slaves?

BIBLE ANSWER (WO)MAN: The Egyptians did not like that the Israelites were _____ because they feared that they would soon overpower all of Egypt. They turned them into slaves so that they could keep control over them and stay in power over the land.

CALLER: I've never seen a burning bush, where do I look for one so that I can hear God talk to me?

BIBLE ANSWER (WO)MAN: Not very many people have seen a burning bush. In fact, Moses is the only person in the whole Bible who saw a burning bush. God talks in different ways to different people. *(List some ways that God could possible talk to people today)*

During the time of Moses the Egyptians didn't believe that God existed or even if He did they didn't think He was any better than their Egyptian gods. God proved them wrong 10 times by sending plagues. Each of these plagues proved that God existed and He was powerful.
