## OLD ELIJAH AND YOUNG ELISHA

In 1 Kings 19, the great prophet Elijah was holed up in a cave feeling defeated and worn out. That's when God spoke to him in the famous "still small voice". 
Complete the following questions which your teacher has checked:

- Read the Study Note at the end of page 2. How are you like an apprentice when you come to church and Sunday School?




**Page 3:** Elijah asks Elisha to stay behind....

### ELI-JAH & ELI-SHUA

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

---

**ELIJAH'S NAME:**  
 "Eli" is the Hebrew word for "God"  
 "Jah" or "Yah-weh" is God's name as spoken to Moses. It means "I am"  
 Thus, Eli-jah's name means "God is Yahweh"

---

**ELISHA'S NAME:**  
 "Sha" or "Shua" in Hebrew means "saves" or "salvation"  
 Eli-sha or Eli-shua name means "God Saves"

---

**JESUS' NAME:**  
 Jesus' Hebrew name was pronounced "Yeshua" or "Jahshua" or "Joshua"  
 Thus.... Jesus' name is a combination of both Elijah and Elisha's names.  
 "Jah" + "Shua" = "Yahweh Saves"

Here are the answers, comments, and follow up questions found in the Elisha Quiz at the end of the story. Print this page as a teacher's guide, or give it to students to write down their answers to the questions, then discuss.

What are you called to do?

**CORRECT!**

They are all correct! A prophet is someone who **challenges others** to take God seriously, and live their lives in obedience to God's commands. Some of the prophets in the Old Testament spoke harsh words to sinful people. Jesus taught us to "speak the truth in love."  
What does that mean?



Is everyone called to be a prophet?

**CORRECT!**

All followers of God will find themselves in a situation that demands that they speak up for what is right. Can you think of some of those situations where you should speak up? Some persons spend a good portion of their lives as prophets. It is their special gift.  
Can you think of some prophets in your world who regularly speak out for God, -for the needs of the poor, and against injustice?



How are you called to be a prophet of God?

**CORRECT!**

God calls us through a variety of ways. Sometimes we hear that still small voice inside us. A person or organization, such as your church, can ask you to become a leader, and **stand up for what is right**. And sometimes the situation you find yourself in demands that you speak up, such as when you see an injustice, or need to be a peacemaker. Can you think of a time when you felt called to speak out?



Can you reject the mantle of Elijah?

**CORRECT!**

Yes, you can refuse God's call. God will be disappointed, but God will stay with you, working toward the day when you listen to his voice.

**Elisha had a choice to make.**

He could pick up the mantle, or leave it in the wilderness. He picked it up because he had learned from Elijah how important it was to be a prophet. Have you "picked up" (accepted) the prophet's mantle from someone?

Who in your family or church has helped you grow in your faith the most? Who could help you grow even more?
