Jesus asked, "How can I describe the Kingdom of God? What story should I use to illustrate it? It is like a tiny seed. Though this is one of the smallest of seeds it grows to become one of the largest of plants, with long branches where birds can come and find shelter." Mark 4:30	mustard	God's Kingdom started with a tiny baby who grew into a Messiah we can all find shelter in.	
Jesus also used this illustration to describe the Kingdom of			
God. "The Kingdom of Heaven is like used by a woman making bread. Even though she used a large amount of flour, the yeast permeated every part of the dough and the yeast made the whole loaf rise." Luke 13:20	yeast	Yeast is a small bacteria that produces carbon dioxide which causes the bread to rise. God's Kingdom breaths air into our lives too.	
One day the Pharisees asked Jesus, "When will the Kingdom of God come?" Jesus replied, "The Kingdom of God isn't ushered in with visible signs. You won't be able to say, 'Here it is!' or 'It's over there!' For the Kingdom of God is Luke 17:20-21	within you	People often think God's Kingdom is heaven -something that comes in the future. Jesus astounded his hearers by saying it was within them now. God's Kingdom is wherever people let God rule -and that begins inside you.	
"The Kingdom of Heaven is like discovered hidden in a field which a man covered up again and excitedly sold everything he had. Matthew 13:44	a treasure	When you realize that God's Kingdom (of Heaven) can be yours, nothing can compare to it, and it will make you rich in the things of God.

Matthew 13:45	the best pearls	Pearls in Jesus' day were rare and valuable. Do you value God's Kingdom as much as the merchant? Are you keeping an eye out for God's Kingdom? Then he said, "I assure you, unless you turn from your sins and become as little children, you will never get into the Kingdom of Heaven.
